<u>TG 90 scarf jewellery roll</u> scarf light weight iron on interfacing 2/3 yard ribbon sewing thread Optional – net gift bags or make bags using the rest of the scarf fabric and thin ribbon

- 1. Unpick the hem and iron the scarf to get rid of the creases
- 2. Measure and cut a piece 30 inches from the badge end
- 3. Fold in half width wise, right side together, and press
- 4. Cut a piece of interfacing to fit one side and iron in place
- 5. Sew the pieces together ¼ inch from the edge and leaving a 2-inch gap on one side



6. Trim the corners. Turn it right side out through the gap



5. Press and close the gap using ladder stitch


6. Fold the badge end to the inside to form a pocket. Make sure that the badge will not be folded. Pin in place on the inside



7. The jewellery roll will fold in half just above the badge. Fold the other end to the wrong side to form a pocket which is about ½inch from the centre fold. Pin in place on the inside




8. Sew all round the shape, 1/8th inch from the edge



9. Mark and sew lines across the pockets to make 2 smaller pockets on the badge end side, three smaller pockets the other. Make sure that the sewing lines do not go through the badge.



]10. Sew the ribbon to the right side at the opposite end to the bade so that when the roll is folded, the ends of the ribbon are the same length to tie







Make a draw string bag.

a. Cut 2 pieces of fabric 4 x $7\frac{1}{2}$ inches. Turn the top of each piece down 2 inches to the wrong side of the fabric.


b. Sew twice across the fold as shown, leaving a gap of about 3/8 inch between the lines of sewing.



c. Sew the 2 pieces together. First in a u shape from under the bottom line of sewing. Then at each end above the top row of sewing.



d. Cut 2 pieces of narrow ribbon, each 5 inches long. Tread one piece through the gap between the lines of sewing on one side of the bag. Continue threading through on the other side of the bag. Both ends of the should be on the same side.



e. Repeat using the other piece of ribbon, threading from the other end of the bag.



f. Push the ends of the ribbon into the inside of the bag through the gaps in the side seams.

g. Turn the bag inside out. Tie the ends of the pairs of ribbons in knots.
