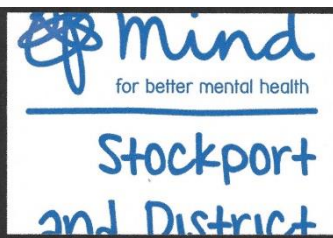
Advocate, Change Agent, Speaker.

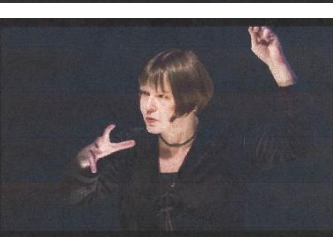
Lady Mary Peters DBE.
